News From Guns on Pegs

New Gamebore Cartridge details

The UK's most popular cartridge brand, Gamebore, have exclusively released details of their latest cartridge products to GunsOnPegs, including an all-new 2 ½ inch 12 bore Regal steel load and significant improvements to their Quad Seal Bio-Wad system.



Despite only having been launched last season, Gamebore's Black Gold Dark Storm Precision Steel with Bio-Wad cartridges have already found many fans, according to the 2021 Game Shooting Census. Employing the trademarked biodegradable, fully certified and 100% environmentally safe Bio-Wad full shot cup, which also incorporates the revolutionary Quad

Seal technology, they were a huge success and proved extremely popular.

However, although the Dark Storm Precision Steel were available in both High Performance and Standard loads, crucially the cartridges were only available in a 70mm case. This meant that the nation's leading cartridge brand did not have a non-plastic wad steel shot offering for those with 2 ½ inch chambers (65mm), typically older side-by-side shotgun users.



All that is now set to change, because GunsOnPegs have revealed that Gamebore are set to release a new steel shot cartridge designed for suitable guns with 2 ½ inch chambers. The New Regal 2 ½ inch Steel employs the same trademarked Bio-Wad technology, and will be suitable for all shotguns Nitro proofed 1954 onwards which are half-choke or less, two key factors you need to check and ensure when using any steel loads in your guns.

For the cartridge geeks among you, there is an interesting difference between Gamebore

cartridges and the 65mm steel cartridges offered by others. The Regal Steel Game has a true crimped closure, rather than, for example, a rolled turnover. Gamebore told Guns on Pegs: The need for a crimp closure in modern cartridges is paramount. Boiled down to layman's terms, the crimp is essential as it isn't there just to hold the shot in but is vital to allow the powder to burn fully and the pressure to develop correctly within the cartridge before the load is released. This is critical to ensure full performance and consistency, whereas a rolled turnover simply cannot do this.


