# **News from Around the Sport**

### Is it the last year for lead shot on game shoots?

With the end of the 2021/22 game season shooters are already thinking about the 2022/23 season. Some are thinking about getting rid of their trusted side-by-side shotguns in favour of a modern over and under or modern side-by-side and as the season has come to an end getting rid of their remaining lead cartridges.

The statement by BASC and others regarding a 5-year voluntary move to steel and then later the Game Trade Associations ban on lead shot game from July 2022 has also caused concern and in some cases confusion to many shooters.

Simply put, a gun in proof, and proofed for "Standard" and "Superior" steel can continue to be used. Those guns stamped for Superior and with a Fleur de Leys symbol may also be used with "High Performance" steel. Cartridge boxes should be marked by the manufacturer with the correct type of steel load contained within the box. Below is a copy of the relevant proof marks previously printed in News Shots.

For those shoots where birds are shared with the guns and beaters and perhaps "friends" of the shoot, there is no compunction or law which requires that guns use steel ammunition.

For clay shooters, it is up to shooting grounds to decide what type of cartridges you may use on the ground and at present there is not a date for any transition to steel shot, although many grounds are now insisting on the use of fibre cartridges.

There are many who will not wish to put steel shot, (its soft iron really) down their barrels but the cartridge manufacturers are working to produce bio degradable fibre wads which emulate the plastic cup wad. At present reactions to those available in the market place are mixed with some worry reports associated with some of the new wads (watch this space for further information). These reports have not been independently confirmed but manufacturers are working hard to have cartridges to the market place for the 2022-23 season.

#### Rules for steel shot use

Check for the appropriate proof mark.

No more than half choke

If in doubt, use bismuth – in fact with a vintage gun, err on the safe side and always use bismuth and even then consider having tight chokes eased open by a gunsmith.

Always read the packaging on your cartridges

With removable chokes only use those clearly marked as suitable for steel.

Being an alloy of iron plus carbon, steel can rust.

People tell horror stories of older steel shot cartridges in which the contents have rusted or even fused into a solid slug! Modern steel shot is coated to prevent rusting so this should not be a problem, however it still makes sense to store your cartridges in a cool dry place.

## **New General Licences Approved**

The government have issued two-year licences for the protection of wildlife and game birds in England.

The new General license issued in January seeks to give a period of stability for the protection of wildlife and game birds in England.

You do not need to apply for the General Licence but must comply with their terms and conditions while undertaking licensed acts. Defra have issued new definitions regarding, wildlife, livestock and gamebirds with gamebirds now contained under the definition of livestock.


