
LEGAL CHALLENGE SET TO DELAY LEAD BAN IN EU

A legal wrangle has emerged in the EU regarding the proposed ban on lead. The European Food Safety Agency (EFSA) appears to have failed to provide the European Federation for Hunting and Conservation, (FACE), with vital information which was needed by FACE to formulate their response to the lead proposals. They have taken their complaint to the EU Ombudsman and they have ruled that there has been serious maladministration. This is likely to have implications for the EU because the Health and Safety Executive and Defra admit to copying much of the EU documentation to formulate their response to a ban on lead.



Although there may be an investigation and perhaps some change in the EU response the ban is viewed as inevitable by many including Simon Ward of the GTA. We await further information.

ALL CHANGE AT ELEY



The French company Sofisport who own Cheddite and NobelSport, with the brands Fob, Tunet, Mary-Arm and the cartridge propellant powder Vectan, have acquired the Spanish company Maxam. The 150-year-old Maxam company has the brands Eley, Rio, Sag, GB and Diana.

Sofisport took over the associated production sites in Vitoria, Spain (Sofiam Iberica) and in Birmingham, UK (Eley Hawk) and the distribution company Rio Outdoors Corp. in the USA.

Disastrous General Licenses Decision in Wales



NRA for Wales have removed magpies, jays, jackdaws from the conservation licence (GL004).

BASC have described this as extremely disappointing and state that this decision will have a disastrous effect on conservation in Wales. In addition, changes to Agricultural licence (GL001) will only allow the control of carrion crow to prevent serious damage to livestock foodstuffs

and to prevent the spread of diseases. Crucially they have omitted the ability to control carrion crow to prevent serious crop damage.

For many the control of pest is a way into shooting and forms the basis of game and clay shooting. It is hoped that these changes do not

have a serious effect on the conservation of species, livelihoods or shooting in general.
