We were pleased to welcome two new Institute members, Lee Dorsett, and Alan Oakley, who had also just passed their Level 1 CPSA Instructor's assessment. Refreshments were once again provided by Heather Cullinan, taking over the Kibworth Café and providing welcoming drinks and snacks, mid-morning snacks and drinks, lunch with puddings and afternoon tea.

The morning started with an introduction to the theory of shooting and the process of getting information from a client in order to plan their lesson to fit their needs.

Participants worked with each other and with the facilitators to develop their observational and diagnostic skills.
