# Olympic Skeet Coaching Development Course

**New Course available for those involved or interested in developing their coaching skills for Olympic Skeet.**

**Olympic Skeet Coaching Course, to be run at East Yorkshire Clay Target Centre on Thursday 27th October 2022.**

The course is designed to assist anyone wishing to understand and/or develop their coaching skills on Olympic Skeet.

This would be an ideal introduction to those who may be considering taking up coaching this discipline.

The course will consist of classroom-based work on:

- What do 'Good' shots do.
- What inexperienced shots do.
- Optimum biomechanical positioning.
- Range work which will allow individuals to observe and practice:
- Gun body and eye placement, including 'quiet eye'.
- The observation of 'Good' shots and shooters displaying faults.
- Body 'Shape' and gun control after the first shot on pairs.
- Application of these methods by yourself.
- Identification of any area of work that needs development.
