This discipline combines sprint running with air gun shooting. Competitors run 400meters then try to shoot 5 knockdown targets with a air rifle with up to 15 pellets and then run a further 400 meters and again shoot 5 targets and then another 400 meters to a finish line.

Paul recently attended the British Shooting Awards at the Royal Armouries in Leeds. Although he did not receive an award on this occasion he used the opportunity to network with the Royal Armouries. We hope to have more information regarding a visit in the Near future

THE ROYAL ARMY

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

CORPS

Royal Army Physical Training Corps Instructors (RAPTCIs) generally serve as detached personnel within most units across the Army. They are tasked by their Commanding Officers with the responsibility of maintaining the physical fitness of their soldiers in preparation for Military Operations. This requires a high level of knowledge and experience in order to design and implement a physical training regime which complements the Unit role and training cycle.

In addition to their physical training specialisation, RAPTCIs also have the opportunity to specialise in Adventurous Training and Exercise Rehabilitation.

THROUGH THE YEARS

The Royal Army Physical Training Corps began life as the Army Gymnastic Staff in 1860 following the Crimean War. Since then, the Corps reputation has grown through the key role it has played in developing and maintaining soldiers' physical readiness for Military Operations. It keeps the Army 'Fit to Fight'.

ZOOM SEMINAR BOOK NOW!


WO1 Steve Hughes will talk on warm up exercises, nutrician and hydration to help shooters.
