NEWS FROM AROUND SHOOTING

NON-LEAD CARTRIDGES

With grouse shooting underway and the main game season soon upon us cartridge manufacturers are ramping up production of their game cartridge range with more options now available for shooters who have to shoot non-toxic shells on their shoots.

The development of new cartridges by the manufacturers has centred on steel and bio-degradable wads. In fact the perfect storm for manufacturer as both components require massive R&D to bring about a cartridge which is shootable, efficient and effective and does not cost an arm and a leg. The move away from lead has made manufacturers look at alternatives with steel, at present, being the nearest alternative to lead. The manufacturing, storage and loading has its own challenges and the use of steel is hard on loading machines which have to be re-calibrated for the steel shot. However, it is perhaps the move away from plastic wads and the need for cupped biodegradable wads which has presented the greatest challenge to manufacturers. The need for a water soluble, compostable, biodegradable cupped wad is both difficult to achieve and expensive. To date the use of starch or plant based products doesn't match the properties of the high density polyethylene used in plastic wads..

Eley Hawk were market leaders with their water soluble Eco wad offered in both clay and game loads. They provide a VIP Steel Pro Eco wad game steel in 32g loads of shot size 3 or 4. They do not provide a High Performance Steel load at present. The Lightening Steel has HDPE wads.





Hull Cartridge Company have introduced the High Pheasant Steel in standard and HP

options. They are loaded with compostable and biodegradable wads Hull also provide a 24g Imperial Traditional Steel in 65mm cartridges specifically for guns chambered in $2^{1/2''}$ chambers.

Lyavale Express, now part of the Fiocchi and

P&G group offer the Express Ultimate Steel with the compostable Earth Wad and loaded in 65mm cases with a rolled over closure which provideds more space within the case for the bio wad and powder.



Gamebore offer the Regal Steel30g load for those with $2^{1/2''}$ chambers. Crimp closed with aa Gen 2 Bio Wad. This wad is brown and water solu-

ble. It features a Quad Seal to improve gas seal and efficiency and with cup petals which overlap at 45°



to improve protection and efficiency. Gamebore's Black Gold Dark Storm Steel loads have Bio Wads with quad seal technology in 70mm cases in 32 g their no 4 shot meets the CIP Standard Steel and no3 shot is High Performance Steel rated so can only be used in guns with the fleur-de-lis symbol.

Shooting Star im-

port the French Joker cartridges, with a cupped fibre wad and the Spanish BioAmmowhich has a bi degradable case and wad.

The choice is vast and what you choose can depend on price. Recent price increases have seen some game cartridges increase by £50:00 per thousand from last season.

The new Pro Comp by Webley and Scott offers shooters an reasonably priced gun with many interesting features.

Both models in the range offer a gloved grip and for many this is an exciting proposition particularly in the fully adjustable model, but for the coach doing a gun fit although the adjustment of length of pull and comb hight are relatively easy, what do you do if the client has massive hands? The area in front of the adjustable comb is rather small and large thumbs tend not to fit!

Best advice for clients who fancy this well made and attractive gun, find a gun shop that has one on their rack and see if it fits your hand. Nobody wants to take a file to a new factory stock particularly if it invalidates the warranty.

In order to attend a coaching course, at least a year must have elapsed between the L1 and the L2 course or one L2 course and another. Also the candidate must have completed the 3 day Common Element which includes the 3 Coach Development Workshops in ESP, ESK & Trap and qualified as a Referee in their chosen discipline. Those who have previously completed a 2 day Common Element will need to complete a one day discipline specific Workshop prior to attending the CTC.




THE INSTITUTE OF CLAY SHOOTING INSTRUCTORS
