

NEWS FROM AROUND SHOOTING

Home Office Statistics

The Gun Trade Association have reported recently on the Home Office statistics regarding various forms of licensing. In the year up to March 2023 there has been a fall in the number of registered firearms dealers (RFD's) by 6% and the number gun licence holders have fallen by 4%. Overall the statistics show a downward trend in shotgun certificate holders. Shotgun shooting has lost nearly 100,00 people in the past 10 years going from 583,000 in 2014 to just over 25,00 this year.

Clearly this is worrying news and Graham Downing of the British Shooting Sports Council points out that although worrying the reasons have to be seen in the context of the pandemic and the fact that several forces suspended grants of certificates.



The statistics also point to the fact that shooters are getting older with 67% of shotgun shooters now over 50 years of age. The need to broaden shotgun shooting to a younger audience has never been more important.

A reminder to members that the consultation on firarms licensing is still open until the 23rd of August and both BASC and the CPSA encourage members to respond to the consultation.

Armed Police Stop Legal Pigeon Shoot

Manchester police raided a legal pigeon shoot and confiscated the shooters shotguns even though they had valid certificate, the landowner confirmed they had permission to shoot over his land and they had not committed any offence. Police had received a complaint and then stopped the shoot. The police have not returned the firearms of given any explanation as to why they took procession of the legally owned shotguns.

United Utilities Ban Grouse Shooting

United Utilities have informed all shoot lease holders that they will not be renewing their leases for shooting over their land. The company which supplies water across the North West of England will close down all grouse shooting on itd land by



2027. Duncan Thomas of BASC commented that the decision was disgraceful and made without consultation and will ruin the relationship between the company, the rural population

and the wildlife across the North Est.

MP Raises GL43 Crisis in Parliament

Sir Jeffrey Clifton-Brown MP, Chairman of the all party shooting and conservation group and Vice President of BASC, raised the issue in Parliament criticising Defra timing on their policy regarding the release of birds. He claims that Defra knew the timetable of bird releases and took action at the last minute throwing many shoots into disarray and causing great losses within the shooting community.

Nathan Hales wins Gold at ISSF Championships!



Congratulations are also due to **Nathan Hales**, who won gold in OT out at the ISSF
Championships In Lonato, Italy. Nathan
showed impressive skills in the qualification round, finishing in first place with a
score of 123/125. In the final, he main-

tained his performance - dropping only one target to finish on 49/50 and earning him a well deserved victory against Qi Ying (CHN).

This is an incredible achievement that sets a new World Record at the ISSF World Cup, breaking the six-year record set by Alberto Fernandez (ESP) of 48/50 targets.

ESP Level 2 - Coach Training Course - Northampton Shooting Ground Monday 18th –20th September

ESK Level 2 - Coach Training Course - Northampton Shooting Ground Monday 18th—20th September 2023

Trap Level 2 - Coach Training Course - Northampton Shooting Ground Monday 18th—20th September 2023

In order to attend a coaching course, at least a year must have elapsed between the L1 and the L2 course or one L2 course and another. Also the candidate must have completed the 3 day Common Element which includes the 3 Coach Development Workshops in ESP, ESK & Trap and qualified as a Referee in their chosen discipline. Those who have previously completed a 2 day Common Element will need to complete a one day discipline specific Workshop prior to attending the CTC.

RISE IN CARS BEING STOLEN IN THE UK


According to data from the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Agency (DVLA), approximately one out of every 100 Land Rovers in circulation was reported stolen between April 2022 and March 2023. These statistics reveal that Land Rovers are three times more likely to be stolen compared to the second most popular target for thieves, which is the Mercedes-Benz.

The concerning situation in car theft is highlighted by information obtained by Confused.com through Freedom of Information requests. Out of the 896,948 licensed Land Rovers in the UK, 8,284 were reported stolen during this period, resulting in a ratio of 924 thefts per 100,000 vehicles.

Notably, Land Rover models dominate the top -10 most stolen list, with six of their vehicles featured. The Range Rover Velar R-Dyn emerged as the most frequently targeted model.

Obviously the theft of any vehicle is distressing but many are stolen off drives when being made ready to go away. Clearly if you have packed your car with guns and your equipment, for a days coaching, such a loss will be considered badly by Police.
